Workshop: All Abroad

National Curriculum Links:

Learning objectives	Session structure	Assessment for learning
To learn about the different roles of people who worked on the railway and the passengers who went on these trains To make connections between the jobs that people had on the railways in the past with those that they have today	Introduction Intro to the museum- split children into groups and ask them to explore the museum to find different characters- people who worked on the railway. Children will then share which characters they have found and start to understand some of the jobs that people on the railway did and why they were important. Session activities Read railway themed story. Children to play the parts of some of the characters and to take part in recalling some of the key phrases used in the book.	Children will explore themes through roleplay, storytelling and art and design activities. We will ask questions throughout to check understanding. Children will have opportunities to respond and give feedback throughout the session.
	Split children into groups and move to activity room so that each child can create a train worker or passenger to go on the train. They will then work in groups to decorate a train engine and its carriages.	

	At the end of activity- Groups to hold up their train and carriage and share some of the people who are on their trains. Plenary Train signal game- explain to the children the different train signals and what they mean. Ask the children to come up with actions for each train signal (stop, slow down, go) and to have a go at acting these out.
